- Approach assignments on deadline with strong communication and follow through with the editors and colleagues

- Take photos and video to illustrate and amplify stories

### QUALIFICATIONS AND COMPENSATION:

We're looking for candidates with at least three years previous news reporting and/or editing experience (some student journalism counts), sound news judgment, flexibility, and the ability to manage ongoing and short-term projects with strong attention to detail and accuracy. Knowledge of the state's political landscape and leaders, previous digital, photography and/or videography experience, and an

entrepreneurial spirit are strong assets. States Newsroom journalists are expected to produce at least four posts per week.

Authorization to work in the United States is required. All States Newsroom employees are required to be fully vaccinated for COVID within 30 days of hire. Bilingual candidates encouraged to apply.

The minimum salary for this position is \$52,000 and rises depending on experience. Our generous benefits package includes:
