MATERNAL & CHILD HEALTH REPORTER

For every 1,000 babies born in Arkansas, eight die before their first birthday. The state's infant mortality rate is nearly 60% higher than the national average. Pregnant mothers enter a system ill-equipped to care for them. For every 100,000 women 15 to 44 in Arkansas, there are just 52 maternity care providers, the lowest share among the 50 states. The national rate is more than three times higher.
